### *Message from our Interim Rector*

Dear Friends—

It's a beautiful part of the country we live in, and, now that the heat wave has ended for the moment, it's a beautiful time of year. I'm feeling even better about summer than usual this year, after our very Vermonty winter. I'm grateful that I got to start at St. John's in the summer months, when the pace of a church's life slows down a bit; it's given me a chance to explore Randolph and environs, and to meet some people in town.

But I'm aware that the next time I sit down to write a note for the newsletter it will be for the *September* newsletter, and we'll be busy putting together the new program year. Then everything will start up again. And that has me thinking about the work ahead of us.

Here are the goals the diocese of Vermont sets out for the "Interim period":

1. To explore the history of this parish and its relationship with previous clergy;
2. To explore the parish's special identity, what it dreams of being and doing and how the ministry of all the people can find expression in its mission;
3. To work with parish leaders and to invite new people to join in leadership;

4. To renew and rework the parish's relationship with the diocese;
5. To help prepare the parish to move into the future with openness to new possibilities.

This covers a lot of ground, of course, but it seems to me the heart of it all is in #2; discovering and celebrating St. John's unique identity.

Many of you have probably spent time in countries English isn't spoken. I once went to Guatemala for a while, and traveled on my own in little towns where there were few tourists. I got used to hearing people speaking a language I hardly knew; it became a sort of wall paper of unusual sounds around me. I was trying to learn Spanish at the time, and so sometimes I'd hear words I recognized and would painstakingly translate them into English.

Every once in a while, though, I would overhear people speaking English, and it was like a little miracle. I can't really convey the experience. When we hear our own language – the one we think in, the one we dream in – we don't really hear words, we hear meaning. It was like opening a window in a stuffy room and feeling a fresh breeze.

I often ask people why they attend a particular church, and they say things like “this church just feels right” or “it just feels like home to me.” But one day someone answered “they speak my language here,” and I remembered my experience in Guatemala. I like to think of different parishes having different God dialects, different languages to open people's eyes to God at work in their lives. The task before us is to recognize the language which is uniquely St. John's so that we can speak it more clearly.

So, here's a question to ponder as you enjoy August in Vermont (or wherever life takes you): what is St. John's “special identity” for you? What is it about the way this parish goes about its life that touches you, that make you feel it's speaking to you in your native tongue? We'll have a number of opportunities to explore this as a community in the months to come, but I'd be grateful for any early thoughts you can share with me. I'm in the office most weeks on Tuesday plus at least one other weekday, of you can reach me by telephone (in the church office or my cell phone, which is 215-370-0479) or e-mail ([rector@stjohnsrandolphvt.org](mailto:rector@stjohnsrandolphvt.org)). Let's talk.
